The world is designed for people without disabilities. For individuals who experience vision, speech, hearing, learning, or mobility impairments, there are countless barriers that limit their access to the everyday things that many of us take for granted. Assistive technology gives them access, and these tools can be the lifeline that helps someone attend school or keep their job after an accident, surgery, or illness; or stay in their home and remain independent.

We also provide Equipment Restoration Services, offering skillfully refurbished, fully sterilized durable medical equipment that assists people with day-to-day activities that they may have trouble doing on their own because of a chronic illness, injury, short or long-term disability, surgery, or the effects of aging. Durable medical equipment is not always covered by health insurance and, because these items are so expensive, they can be unaffordable for many. Ours is the only program of its kind in Connecticut, providing equipment at extremely discounted rates (the average discount is about 80% off the item's original value.)
