Group Homes

Oak Hill's group homes provide quality homes for children and adults with intellectual and physical disabilities. Our homes are located throughout Connecticut. Each home has been carefully designed to accommodate the needs of the people living in them. We have full-time and part-time support staff, supervisors, nurses, speech therapists, occupational therapists, physical therapists and social workers. Our staff also includes dietitians, managers, and behavior specialists.

Most participants have their own bedroom. Two to eight program participants live in a home with the average being six per home. We offer homes for children and adults and we work with each program participant's planning team to provide a successful transition. Homes for children under 21 are dedicated to supporting children with medically complex needs or behavioral challenges and to providing continuity of learning from school to home.

Every Oak Hill group home features:

- Individualized program plans
- Highly qualified professionals
- Daily person-centered activities designed to enhance learning and personal competencies
- Leisure time activities that encourage the pursuit of hobbies and development of friendships
- Emphasis on community integration
- Safe, comfortable, and personalized environments
