- instructional units based on national comprehensive school health standards

- scenarios for discussion, role-play and skill rehearsal
- differentiated chapter tests that assess knowledge and judgment

An efficacy study of *Positive Choices* was completed by researchers at George Mason University in Virginia, indicate statistical significance for the intervention groups in acquiring sexual health knowledge.
